Dear Parents,

It is pleasing to report, the concerns that I, along with many, had about the new SOPs and how they may negatively impact the children's learning and enjoyment of school, have shown to be unproven in these first few weeks of school.

As I walk around the school, it is clear to see that everyone has adapted exceptionally well to the new rules and timetables. In the classrooms, the children are happy, engaged in and enjoying their learning. The teachers are now are teaching the normal curriculum subjects and topics, along with being able to take their classes outside to learn as well as engage in physical and wellbeing activities.

It is satisfying to see the school in near-normal operation and to be able to give the children those essential experiences and opportunities which promote their love of learning and the school.

This week, we started the GL assessment in English and Maths. These are assessments we would have done in May, but due to the MCO, had to be postponed. These tests will give us an indication as to the children's abilities and support target settings and teacher planning. I will report on our findings once we have completed all year groups.

Yesterday, I hosted the first Prefect lunch of the year, and they will begin supporting the students and teachers next week. Next week, we will be selecting the House Captains. The children have settled back into school life exceptionally well, and it has been fantastic to see our new starters in Nursery make the transition from a staggered start to full mornings. Each year group is showing engagement, and enthusiasm with learning, despite the current restrictions on resources and our classrooms are full of smiling, happy children.
