Dear Parents,

There was no stopping the learning this week, after the well needed mid-term break. The children were straight back to work with Year 2 becoming Toymakers, Nursery acting out the well-know story, 'Room on The Broom' by Julia Donaldson and Year 5 starting a Music unit on Bucket Drumming. Year 3 were investigating shadows, Reception children dressing up as their favourite character in their Entry Point for their topic, 'Let's Pretend'. Year 4 began their IPC topic 'Footprints from the Past' which included assuming the role of palaeontologists and excavating their dinosaur eggs. They even had a visit from a 7-foot dinosaur!

### Response Guide

On Thursday, I sent out the COVID-19 Response Guide For Parents. The feedback provided by parents and the time and effort given by the Parent Class Reps was positive and useful in clarifying certain grey areas. The information provided enabled the school to create a Response Guide that is simple and clear.

### Four Essentials

Four essential points came out of the meeting and needed to be recognised when using the guide. These are;

1. The school's priority is the wellbeing of all children in the community.
2. If your child is unable to attend school, work will be posted in Google Classroom.
3. The School will not share any details of cases or personal information of families.
4. The Ministry of Health (MOH) will determine all requirements for quarantine and testing.

Although now redundant due to the CMCO, this guide will still be relevant when we can return to school.

We will be celebrating Deepavali on Thursday 12th November, and although we will not be in school, all children are encouraged to dress in traditional Indian clothing.
