Change of School Name

With the expansion into Year 7 and 8, the school can no longer use Primary in its official name. Hence, it will revert to its original title, **St. Christopher's International School**. However, the acronym SCIPS has become so linked to the school that it will remain, as the P can stand for both Primary and Prep.

COVID Update

The school will open this term with the same MOE/MOH SOPs as we finished Term 3 in July. This allows for near-normal operations and ensures the health and wellbeing of all.

It is expected that masks be worn when in the classroom, except for children in the Early Years, and they are optional when outside. There are no longer temperature checks, restrictions on the direction of movement or rules on distancing.

Hand sanitising/washing/hygiene will continue, and we will now hold integrated activities such as assemblies and playtimes where children from different year groups will mix. Along with this we will continue to operate the same staggered dismissal procedures as this has helped ease traffic flow at the end of the day.

Please be assured we continue to monitor the systems in place to ensure that the health and well-being of the children remain our priority.

The school has updated our [COVID Response Guide](#). The purpose of this guide is to support decision-making and eliminate any uncertainty about what action the school requires and what members of the school community will take when faced with the varied and different situations related to COVID-19. It also is designed to answer frequently asked questions.

School improvements

Over the summer break, extensive work has been carried out, and these improvements will have a positive impact on the children's learning as well as improve the look and feel of the school.

So when you next walk around the school, you will notice the following;

- **Nursery Outdoor Learning Space** - The area in front of the Nursery Classrooms has had a major upgrade to make it a purpose-built outdoor learning space for our youngest children. This area will be called 'Ms Edith's Garden' in memory of our much-loved Nursery teacher, who passed away last October.
- **Year One and Two Outdoor Learning Space** - Improvements to the outdoor learning space behind the Year One and Two Classrooms include easier access via sliding double doors, resurfacing the area, and installing an overhead cover.
- **New School Shop and Larger Parent Waiting Area** - The school shop has moved next to the cafe, and the covered parent waiting area has been expanded.
- **Year 7 and 8 Classrooms and Science Lab** - The Prep classrooms and Science Lab have been completed, and a new outdoor learning/socialising breakout space has been created for the older students.
- **Kampung Playground** - The playground has been fully refurbished and is ready to have the children back playing again.
- **All Weather Surface** - The back of the school has been transformed into one expansive space with the removal of the tennis court, stone path and four square area removal. This whole space has been covered with artificial grass enabling the children to use it throughout the year.

Home / School Agreement

It is common in international schools to have a home/school agreement. This is a set of statements explaining the school's aims and values and the commitment made by both parties when a child is enrolled.

The reasons for the Home/School Agreement are;

1. It underpins the school's ethos and stated beliefs
2. It is a clear starting point for new and current parents and the school staff
3. It provides a starting point for exploring difficulties.

I hope you can see that this is a positive step in reconnecting the parents and the school and enables the rebuilding of strong relationships. This will be sent out to you shortly.
